





HOW TO COOK A POTATO CASSEROLE

Key Ingredients in Sweet Potato Casserole:

Sweet potatoes: You'll need 3 pounds of sweet potatoes.

Brown Sugar: You either use light or dark brown sugar to add the sweetness with a touch of molasses flavor.

Unsalted butter: Let the butter come to room temperature so that it melts quickly and easily into the sweet potatoes.

Mini marshmallow: Mini Marshmallow cover the top of the casserole more evenly than full sized marshmallows.

Vanilla extract: Adding Vanilla extract brings out the natural sweetness of the sweet potatoes.

Other needed ingredients:
Milk or Half and Half
Kosher Salt

How to make sweet potato Casserole:

Cook the sweet potatoes, Simmer peeled and cut sweet potatoes until a fork easily slides through the largest piece, then drain and return to the pot. Mash with butter, brown sugar, and seasonings. Add unsalted butter,milk, and half-and-half, brown sugar, Vanilla extract, and kosher salt into the pot. Mash with a potato masher until smooth.

Bake the Sweet potato casserole:

Transfer the sweet potato mixture to a 9x13 inch baking dish and top with miniature marshmallow. Bake until potatoes are hot and the miniature marshmallows and puffed and golden.
